#### From the Pastor:

I am currently reading a book by and about Dr. Thomas Oden entitled "A Change of Heart". He was a well known seminary professor back when I was beginning my preparations for ministry. It is a memoir about his journey from personal faith through the corridors of academics where he was a professor at some of the most prestigious university seminaries in the land and sojourned on to a personal faith renewed and refreshed. As I was reading I kept seeing references to the familiar theologian Karl Barth mentioned. I remember reading some time ago a story about Barth that I wasn't sure if it was a simple legend or if the story was actually accurate. Turns out that it was indeed most likely accurate, though it took place many years ago. This brilliant scholar/theologian/writer/ was giving a lecture when the following took place:

He was at the Rockefeller Chapel on the campus of the University of Chicago during his lecture tour of the U.S. in 1962. After his lecture, during the Q & A time, a student asked this deep thinker – Karl Barth - if he could summarize his whole life's work in theology in a sentence. Barth allegedly said something like "Yes, I can. In the words of a song I learned at my mother's knee: 'Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so." That is the simple, basic story. If I were to make such a statement, I would be charged with being simple minded. In fact, we were often ridiculed for such basic foundational beliefs as having "only" a "Sunday School faith." You can understand why I so very much appreciate our children, youth, and adult Sunday school teachers here at Jonestown Methodist. The reality was that it became a profoundly impacting statement not because of the words that Barth chose but because of the life testimony that provided the context to present it as his basic belief. Given all Barth's knowledge, all his writings, lectures, and conversations, this was the transformational truth, his story.

If you were to narrow down your faith into a single sentence, a foundation upon which your faith stands, or a sentence which provides a springboard to share the Gospel with someone who is skeptical or searching for a path of faith to the Lord – what might it be for you? More importantly, beyond the words, how does your life and faith present the message of God's love, grace, forgiveness, hope, peace and joy as believable, available to any who seeks it?

How does the love of God properly provide the setting, clarity, understanding, and truth to deliver the message that God desires for us - - to be set from the fear of judgment... to discover the beauty of new life, grace, healing, and mercy... to embrace the invitation to be the children of God... to be empowered to live, walk, and minister in the Holy Spirit as a child of God... forever? Paul encouraged the Philippian believers with a simple basic invitation that we do well to hear these many years later:

Isaiah 55: 10 and 11; "As the rain and the snow

come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish, so that it yield seed for the sower and bread for the eater, so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it."

Moses in Deuteronomy makes several long teaching reminder speeches to the people of Israel. Example-Deut 4: 5 and 6; "See, I have taught you decrees and laws as the Lord my God command me, so that you may follow them in the land you are entering to take possession of it. If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ [in other words if knowing Jesus has had an impact on your life...], if any comfort from His love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being likeminded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves.

With all the theology and words that Paul taught, the volumes combined in all his letters and messages, he focuses our attention not on his words, but on the impact of knowing Jesus, and the invitation to a life that is different because it has encountered the living Jesus Christ who opens the door to the Father and welcomes the power of the Spirit – not simply the words, not simply the teachings, but a life wondrously built upon a basic fundamental belief. The words simply point to a living truth. Like Barth - - we start with the basics... "Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so"....



**2024** Annual Conference and **2024** (Postponed from **2020**) General Conference There were some major changes at both conferences this past year.

### General Conference:

The amount of money coming from Annual Conferences to the General Church were reduced from a current base rater 3.29% to 2.6% (2025-2026) and 2.9% (2027-2028 – if the collection rate is 90% or higher in '25-'26). This is an adjustment due to the residual effects of challenges from the pandemic and the impact of disaffiliation of approximately 20% of the churches from the denomination.

Revision of the Social Principles – first time in nearly 50 years. In addition to language changes regarding human sexuality and inclusiveness, advocating for human dignity and combating racism, caring for the planet and supporting healthy community settings for all people economically, socially, and politically.

The Paragraph 2553 offering a path for disaffiliation was officially ended.

Ordained Deacons are now permitted to preside at the sacraments – Holy communion and Baptism – in their appointed assignments. This is especially helpful for those serving as chaplains.

The removal from the Book of Discipline the prohibitions of appointment and ordination of "self-avowed practicing homosexuals" and also the prohibition of performing same-sex marriages. Language protecting the rights of pastors to still determine what marriages they will/will not perform and also for the churches to make a determination of what services will be held within their facilities. This particular action brought forward the re-instatement of a pastor's orders who had them removed under the previous language of the discipline.

### **Annual Conference:**

The Annual Conference, in line with the General Conference approved the change to a new pension program for the conference and denomination. This new program is a personal and private type program funded by the churches and pastors and monitored and facilitated but not funded by the annual conference.

There were nine churches closed.

A memorandum of understanding was established to consolidate staffing and leadership between the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference and ours in Eastern PA.

A budget for the E PA Conference was approved.

There were three ministers ordained as elders including the pastor at Kochenderfer UMC – Jeff Kapp (son-in-law of Rev. Dr. Rodney Shearer who has recently spoken at out Red Rose Sunday); Four individuals were commissioned toward elders orders and one toward deacons orders.

Disaffiliation—General Conference/Annual Conference/Jonestown UMC

As mentioned above, the door through the normal disaffiliation process has officially closed as of December 31, 2023. Because of the threatened anticipated expense levied against churches in our conference, our church and 50+ other churches entered a legal challenge to allow our congregation to depart the denomination. To update, we are awaiting what is called "Summary Judgement" by the judge in Montgomery County hearing the case who will decide if there are sufficient ground to proceed and hear the case in court. If so, the case may be heard in the first half of 2025. If he refuses to move the case forward, congregations will be left with a choice to stay or pursue other directions for the future. We'll keep you posted. Keep our leadership, the Conference leadership, and the court in your prayers as we continue to attempt to seek/discern God's direction forward.

In response to some inquiries I am including the info on the church activity last years as to our support of missions. Some of these items are ongoing and some are monthly and some are budgeted items. In 2023 we gave the following to the missionaries that we support though budgeted amounts.

Heinsmans/Team \$1300.00 Pahutskis/Pioneers \$1300.00 Samuteb Hospital 700.00 Our Daily Bread \$100.00

In addition these we support through our monthly special offerings, On these what comes during the month goes directly out to the mission.

January - AMMI \$225.00

February -JOY \$998.00 (Some people give to this all year long and everything goes to

March -Lenten Offering \$205.00 (This is decided each year by the board to support a special need. In 2023 it went to Back to school blessing through the NL Ministerium.

April – Camping \$425.00 Usually on one of the months we get a special offering for what was Camping Scholarships. With the few campers we are supporting right now we have changed April, to NL Ministerium. We do have people that support Gretna Glenn on a regular basis and anything that comes in for Gretna or the Camping scholarships we give directly to the Camp.

May -UMCOR \$1058.00 Disaster relief through One Great Hour of Sharing

June -Red Rose \$6245.00 The Trustees are supposed to designate a project each year for this offering. None was designated in 2023.

July-ALIGN \$350.00 August -LCCM \$825.00

September -Shoebox \$1200.00 This is for the shoebox postage for the boxes we fill. This is handled

through Samaritans Purse.

October – Lebanon Rescue Mission \$1735.00 November -Bill Lovelace \$330.00

December -Northern Lebanon Ministerium \$1294.00 Each year December is designated by the Ad. Board. In 2023 It was decided to give it to The newly formed Northern Lebanon Ministerium to help with start up costs.

Usually on one of the months we get a special offering for what was Camping Scholarships. With the few campers we are supporting right now we have changed the to April offering to the Northern Lebanon Ministerium. We do have people that provide support to Gretna Glenn on a regular basis and anything that comes in for Gretna or the Camping scholarships we give directly to the Camp.

I hope this helps clear up any questions on the missions of JUMC and how the offerings are designated.

In the future I will try to update more often probably on a quarterly basis.

In the mean time pleas contact me with any questions you may have.
