From the Pastor:

I was looking through some of my materials from a leadership teaching I was part of some years ago and came across a piece entitled "The Five G's" from Ministry Advantage. I've seen the church over the years in different places become complacent about its future. Sometimes people simply have become weary... sometimes people have become discouraged by the sense that they are all alone in doing what needs done... Sometimes the weight of the task of ministry seems overwhelming and they feel that there is no relief in sight. It is when we have reached our end that we finally face the reality that there are some things that are way beyond our capacity as a human being. The article used an illustration of a farmer...

A farmer has no power to make his crop grow. He prepares the field, sows the seed, fertilizes soil, and protects the plants from parasites, but he cannot create life. Yet every good farmer cultivates his crop because he knows he must do the RIGHT things even if he can't do the most important thing. Most of all, he pays attention to the health of his field. He analyzes it constantly, observing the important indicators of life: seedlings that break through the soil, green color that denotes life and health, and changes that show growth. If those things are absent, he works to reverse the detrimental effects of whatever threatens his crop. He takes all of this action, yet remains utterly dependent on something other than what he himself can do to make his crop successful. Such is the life of a farmer.

And such is the life of the church! The apostle Paul said, "You are God's field," in 1 Corinthians 3:9. It is the proper place to be - completely dependent on God. We must look for the signs of life and combat the presence of what threatens our spiritual health both individually and collectively. We strive to put in place things that build a healthy church and church environment. We are caretakers, not creators.

What are the signs of spiritual life and health? Specifically, how can we look at our church as a whole and know that, "These signs indicate we are doing well," or, "This situation is a problem and we must work for change?" We need a diagnostic tool.

The Five Gs are our attempt to draw, in broad strokes, the picture of a healthy church. If we have participating members living out these characteristics, we're doing OK. If people aren't progressing along these lines, something has to change.

Let's look at 5 G's that are vital to healthy growth as individuals <u>and</u> also as a church:

<u>1. GRACE</u> God's grace is not only the beginning place of our spiritual journey, in fact it begins before we make any decisions ourselves – it is God's decision for us and the foundation of our relationship with Him. Grace is a word that means, "a favor we didn't earn", a gift of God Himself. It is where we start the Christian life, but God's grace involves more because He did a lot of work behind the scenes long before we responded and continues long after He came to us in the person of Jesus Christ, who by means of His death on the cross, He paid our crippling sin debt. He comes to us, pursuing us even in our waywardness, and points us in a new direction.

In Eugene Petersons version of the Word of God called "The Mes-

sage". Paul's letter to the Ephesians ends with a subtitle-A fight to the finish-Ephesians6: 10-18. "And that about wraps it up. God is strong, and He wants you strong. So take everything the Master has set out for you, well-made weapons of the best materials. And put them to use so you will be able to stand up to everything the devil throws your way. This is no afternoon athletic contest that we'll walk away from and forget about in a couple of hours. This is for keeps, a life or death fight to the finish against the devil and all his angels.

"Be prepared. You're up against far more than you can handle on your own. Take all the help you can get, every weapon God has issued, so that when it's all over but the shouting you'll still be on your feet. Truth, righteousness, peace, faith, and salvation are more than words. Learn how to apply them.

[From the Pastor Con't] <u>**2. GROWTH**</u>

The second "G", *Growth*, is about our ongoing response to God's grace over a lifetime. Our walk with God *begins* by grace and it also *continues* by grace. We would easily recognize a problem if a newborn didn't continue to grow or fail to thrive. Since relationship with God is life, we expect it to continually exhibit development. We discover a balance between owning the responsibility to grow – which requires resisting what keeps us from growing – and trusting in the help and power of the Holy Spirit to bring about Christlike character in us. That tension will be with us all of our lives. Are you continuing to grow? …Our ministry together?

3. GROUPS: Relationships That Optimize Life-Change God gave us each other, the body of Christ, where we serve each other in various ways. This is just how God designed it. When we're with members of a group, whether formally casually grown, others can powerfully remind us of what we can't see – both visionary and corrective - that God is working in us, through us, encouraging or correcting us. Our walk is not a solo adventure. We must decide for ourselves, but we should-n't only live for ourselves. A Christ-follower honors God's call to participate in community in order to grow in Christlikeness, to express and receive love, and to carry out the ministry of the church.

4. GIFTS: God-given abilities used for the common good.

God gave us different gifts and different abilities so we'd do different things – and need each other. The gifts God gives us are not simply for ourselves, they are the tools for ministry to and with one another. Like a body with differing organs, our different roles and activities bring LIFE to the church; if we become separated from each other, we suffer, like a limb out of joint within a body.

5. GOOD STEWARDSHIP: Finally, a reasonable response to our gracious God.

Christ-followers realize that they have been bought with the price of Christ's blood, and that everything they are and have belongs to Him. In light of this, they desire to be responsible caretakers of the spiritual and material resources that God has entrusted to them. In response to Christ's abundant giving, they increasingly submit their resources of time, talent, treasure to His Lordship and display a spirit of generosity and cheerfulness in being engaged in the ministry of the Gospel in the world.

Focus and intention, commitment and mission, are all essential to a vibrant spiritual life and church. We connect with the living God by grace and grow in Him day by day... we celebrate and engage in a dynamic personal spiritual walk as well as a ministry that bears witness to the world around us. We receive gifts for ministry, hone those gifts to be available to not only the body of Christ but also in outreach to the world around us as we are good stewards of what we have and who we are. The 5-G's are a good barometer of a dynamic living growing disciple of Jesus. How are your G's? [PONDER Con't] You'll need them throughout your life. God's word is an <u>indispensable</u> weapon. In the same way, prayer is essential in this ongoing warfare. Pray hard and long. Pray for your brothers and sisters. Keep your eyes open. Keep each other's spirits up so that no one falls behind or drops out." Based on these verses, Jean Shaw wrote the short article "Stand Firm to the End." We who love the Lord are to hate sin. Indeed, the Christian life is a battle against it. That's why we are equipped to be soldiers (Ephesians 6). Sometimes the veterans get tired and decide to leave warfare to the young recruits. Fighting for truth and justice is wearying...

Moses was past 80 when he led the Israelites out of Egypt. The next 40 years were full of fighting. Moses got weary...

At 120 Moses was still warning the people about sin... in Hebrews 11, it says, "He regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward (11/26). Looking ahead. Anticipating the day when he would be with the Lord. When we feel like quittingretiring or even going AWOL-let us remember Moses and look ahead. When we have fought the last battle, God stands ready to welcome us to eternal peace.
